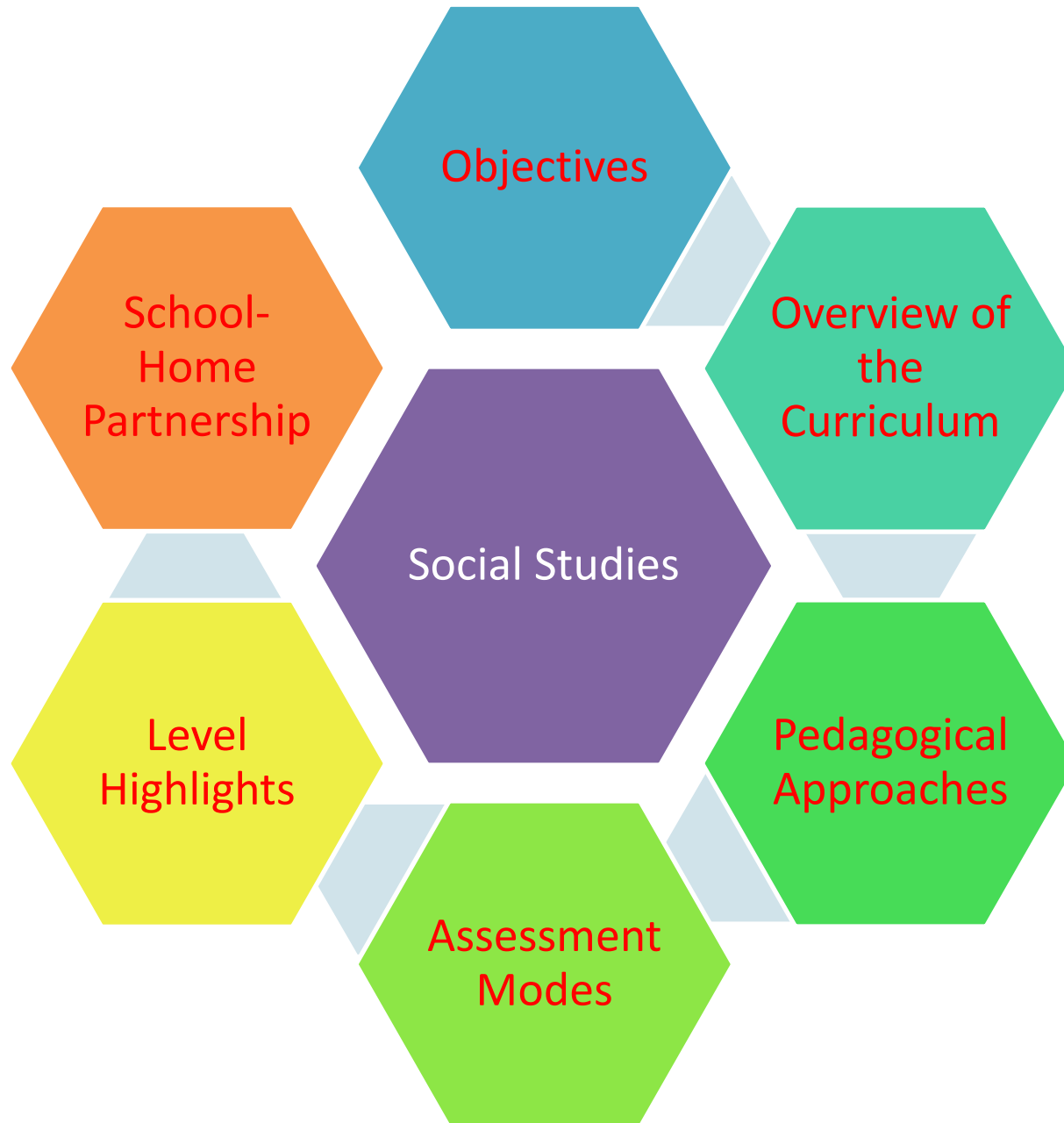

nurture dispositions that will inspire students to show concern for the society and the world in which they live



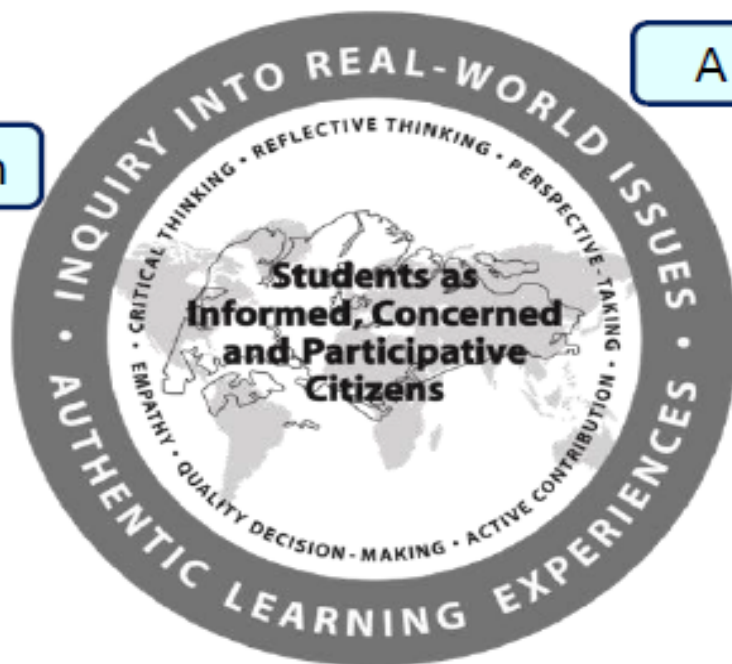
help students demonstrate empathy in their relationships with others

### An Informed Citizen

- Someone who:
- Understands national and global issues through multiple perspectives.



### A Concerned Citizen

- Someone who:
- Has a sense of belonging to his/her community and nation.

### A Participative Citizen

- Someone who:
- Is empowered to take personal and collective responsibility, and serves to make a positive difference to others.

- Use of Inquiry Focus Questions and Guiding Questions
  - P6 Inquiry Focus: How are the legacies of our civilizations seen in our lives today?
  - In what ways are the features of the ancient civilisations seen in our lives today?
  - How do the legacies of the civilisations of the Indian subcontinent influence our lives today?
  - How do the legacies of the Chinese civilisations influence our lives today?
- Emphasis on Skills and Values for Citizenship Education
  - Skills and values are explicitly articulated to give emphasis to the development of a holistic student, well-equipped to play the role of an informed, concerned and participative citizen.

## Assessment Modes

Teachers will monitor students' progress through teaching and learning in the classroom.

Non-weighted assessments will be utilised to support students' learning, gauge their progress and address learning gaps.

Written tasks and oral presentations serve as checkpoints to allow teachers to gather information about students' learning.
